Section 9.21. Animal Control and Licenses

Subd. 2.

<u>License Required</u>. No person shall own, keep, harbor or have custody of any dog over six (6) months of age without first obtaining a license therefor from the City Clerk or his agent. Applications for license shall be made on forms prescribed by the City Clerk, which form shall set forth: (1) the name and address of the owner, (2) the name and address of the person making application, if other than the owner, and (3) the breed, sex, and age of the dog for which a license is sought. No license shall be issued to any person other than the owner except upon the written request of the owner. All dogs required to be licensed shall wear a collar and have a tag firmly affixed thereon evidencing such license for the current year.

Subd. 3.

Requirements for License. License shall be valid for a period of one (1) year commencing January 1 and expiring December 31 of the year issued; and, except as hereinafter provided shall be issued only upon payments of an annual license fee to the City Clerk. A prorated license shall be issued if the application for a new license is received after July 1.

Every application for a license shall be accompanied by a certificate from a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog to be licensed have been given a vaccination against rabies within the time hereinafter specified.

No license shall be granted for a dog which has not been vaccinated against rabies as provided in this section on such a date that not more than three years have elapsed from the date of such vaccination to the time of the expiration of the license to be issued. Vaccination shall be performed only by a doctor qualified to practice veterinary medicine in the state in which the dog is vaccinated.
