## 2020 Mayor and Council Budget - Discussion Document

## Introduction

The Mayor and Council Department provides funding for the activities the Mayor and City Council. The City Council has consistently made adequate funding for education and training of the City Council a high priority. In addition, this budget of this department provides for membership fees and dues for organizations that benefit the city as a whole.

The core duties of this department are as follows:

- ✓ Payment of Salary and Wages for the Mayor and City Council. This salary is adopted by the City Council every two years during a general election year
- ✓ Conferences, educational sessions, and other training opportunities and related costs
- The City is a member of the League of Minnesota Cities and the Coalition of Greater Minnesota Cities, which makes up just over 75% of the dues and subscriptions portion of this department. Dues for 2020 are estimated at \$13,500 for LMC and \$28,299 for CGMC. CGMC also has made a request of \$4,102 for the Voluntary Environmental Action Fund. This was not recommended for approval by the Budget Committee. There are several other annual subscriptions/contributions included in this budget. The largest is a contribution to West Central Initiative for \$8,000. West Central has requested an increase to \$8,250 for 2020.

**City Engagement and Collaboration:** City participation and engagement with the League of Minnesota Cities and the Coalition of Greater Minnesota Cities is important to ensure a well-trained and educated City Council and staff.
