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# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

#### TRANSITION PLAN NEED AND PURPOSE

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has enacted a requirement that all local agencies with greater than 50 employees or who are slated to receive federal funding included in the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) must develop and adopt an ADA Transition Plan or be substantially working towards completion of the plan. If the local agency does not have their Transition Plan completed or in progress, the agency risks losing federal funding for transportation projects.

Each agency is required to complete a self-evaluation/survey of its facilities, policies and practices as it relates to the requirements set forth in The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Repair or replacement of deficient facilities must be noted and addressed in a formal transition plan.

In June of 2017, the City of Alexandria conducted an inventory of pedestrian facilities within its public right of way consisting of the evaluation of the following facilities:

- 41.3 miles of sidewalks/trails
- 840 curb ramps
- 69 traffic control signals (by leg)
- 0 bus stops

The City of Alexandria evaluated their curb ramps on a 1-4 rating system to separate out various severities of non-compliance allowing the City to better prioritize ramp replacement.

The City of Alexandria has been replacing sidewalks and curb ramps as part of street improvement projects. In general, the street department has been making improvements from west to east in the downtown area.

Requests for accessibility improvements can be submitted to the City Engineer or Public Works Division Director – Streets & Stormwater, Street Department.

The City of Alexandria has identified specific locations as priority areas for planned accessibility improvement projects. These areas have been selected based on their poor condition and the receipt of public comments. The priority areas as identified in the June 2017 self-evaluation are as follows:

- Between 7<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Lake Street to Maple Street
- Between 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue and 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue from Lake Street to Nokomis Street

Many other agencies are responsible for pedestrian facilities within the jurisdiction of the City of Alexandria. The City will coordinate with those agencies to track and assist in the facilitation of the elimination of accessibility barriers along their routes.

#### **SCHEDULE**

The City of Alexandria has set the following schedule goals for improving the accessibility of its pedestrian facilities within the City jurisdiction:

- After 10 years, not less than 90% of accessibility features within the priority areas identified by City staff would be ADA compliant.
- After 20 years, not less than 90% of accessibility features within the jurisdiction of the City would be ADA compliant.

### ADA COORDINATOR

The City of Alexandria has identified an ADA Title II Coordinator to oversee the City policies and procedures.

### IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

#### **METHODOLOGY**

The City of Alexandria will utilize two methods for upgrading pedestrian facilities to the current ADA standards. The first and most comprehensive of the two methods are the scheduled street and utility improvement projects. All pedestrian facilities impacted by these projects will be upgraded to current ADA accessibility standards. The second method is the stand alone sidewalk and ADA accessibility improvement project which is updated annually by City Council action. These projects will be incorporated into the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) on a case by case basis as determined by the City of Alexandria.

### GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

If users of the City of Alexandria facilities and services believe the City has not provided reasonable accommodation, they have the right to file a grievance.

The City has developed a grievance procedure for the purpose of the prompt and equitable resolution of citizens' complaints, concerns, comments, and other grievances. This grievance procedure is outlined in Appendix D.

### PROGRESS MONITORING

The City of Alexandria's transition plan is a living document that will receive routine updates. Appendices will be updated annually to reflect the year's completed projects. Self-evaluation will be performed every five years to ensure facilities are compliant with the current standards. This document will be reviewed annually as part of the CIP process and updated as needed. There will be an annual progress report made to the City Council. This Transition Plan is available to the public continually through the city's website.

### SELF-EVALUATION RESULTS

This initial self-evaluation of pedestrian facilities yielded the following results:

- 15% of sidewalks/trails (by length) met accessibility criteria
- 21% of necessary curb ramp locations met accessibility criteria (Curb Ramp Rating 1)
- 25% of necessary curb ramp locations had detectable warnings but were non-compliant overall (Curb Ramp Rating 2)
- 42% of necessary curb ramp locations had no detectable warnings but did have a ramp (Curb Ramp Rating 3)
- 12% of necessary curb ramp locations did not have any curb ramps (Curb Ramp Rating 4)
- 29% of traffic control signals were compliant

### SCHEDULE / BUDGET INFORMATION

#### **COST INFORMATION**

#### **UNIT PRICES**

Construction costs for upgrading facilities can vary depending on each individual improvement and conditions of each site. Costs can also vary on the type and size of project the improvements are associated with. Listed below are representative 2017 costs for some typical accessibility improvements based on if the improvements are included as part of a retrofit type project, or as part of a larger comprehensive capital improvement project.

Intersection corner ADA improvement retrofit: +/- \$3,000 per ramp

Traffic control signal APS upgrade retrofit: +/-\$ 7,500 per signal leg

Sidewalk / Trail ADA improvement retrofit: +/- \$5.00 per SF

#### **IMPROVEMENT COST**

Reconstruct 665 pedestrian ramps: \$1,995,000

Traffic control signal APS upgrades (23 City responsibility): \$172,500

Sidewalk / Trail ADA improvement retrofit (SF): \$4,650,360

Total: \$6,817,860

#### PRIORITY AREAS

Based on the results of the self-evaluation, the estimate costs associated with eliminating accessibility barriers within the targeted priority areas is as follows:

Reconstruct 46 pedestrian ramps: \$184,000
Sidewalk ADA improvement retrofit (46,900 SF): \$234,500

Total: \$418,500

#### **ENTIRE JURISDICTION**

Based on the results of the self-evaluation, the estimated costs associated with providing ADA accessibility within the entire jurisdiction is \$6,817,860 regardless of responsible authority. This amount signifies a significant investment that the City of Alexandria is committed to making in the upcoming years with the assistance of other responsible agencies where applicable. A systematic approach to providing accessibility will be taken in order to absorb the cost into the City of Alexandria budget for improvements to the public right of way.

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### INTRODUCTION

#### TRANSITION PLAN NEED AND PURPOSE

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has enacted a requirement that all local agencies with greater than 50 employees or who are slated to receive federal funding included in the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP) must develop and adopt an ADA Transition Plan or be substantially working towards completion of the plan. If the local agency does not have their Transition Plan completed or in progress, the agency risks losing federal funding for transportation projects.

Each agency is required to complete a self-evaluation/survey of its facilities, policies and practices as it relates to the requirements set forth in The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Repair or replacement of deficient facilities must be noted and addressed in a formal transition plan.

The ADA, enacted on July 26, 1990, is a civil rights law prohibiting discrimination against individuals on the basis of disability. ADA consists of five titles outlining protections in the following areas:

- 1. Employment
- 2. State and local government services
- 3. Public accommodations
- 4. Telecommunications
- 5. Miscellaneous Provisions

Title II of the ADA pertains to the programs, activities and services public entities provide. As a provider of public transportation services and programs, The City of Alexandria must comply with this section of the Act as it specifically applies to public service agencies. Title II of the ADA provides that, "…no qualified individual with a disability shall, by reason of such disability, be excluded from participation in or be denied the benefits of the services, programs, or activities of a public entity, or be subjected to discrimination by any such entity." [42 USC. Sec. 12132; 28 CFR. Sec. 35.130].

As required by Title II of ADA, 28 CFR. Part 35 Sec. 35.105 and Sec. 35.150, The City of Alexandria conducted a self-evaluation of its facilities found within public rights of way and developed this Transition Plan detailing how the organization will ensure that all of these facilities are accessible to all individuals. This document serves as a supplement to The City of Alexandria's existing Transition Plan covering buildings, services, programs and activities.

#### ADA AND ITS RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER LAWS

Title II of ADA is companion legislation to two previous federal statutes and regulations: the Architectural Barriers Acts of 1968 (ABA) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

The ABA is a Federal law that requires facilities designed, built, altered or leased with Federal funds to be accessible. The Architectural Barriers Act marks one of the first efforts to ensure access to the built environment.

Section 504 is a Federal law that protects qualified individuals from discrimination based on their disability. The nondiscrimination requirements of the law apply to employers and organizations that receive financial assistance from any Federal department or agency. Title II of ADA extended this

coverage to all state and local government entities, regardless of whether they receive federal funding or not.

#### AGENCY REQUIREMENTS

Under Title II, The City of Alexandria must meet these general requirements:

- Must operate their programs so that, when viewed in their entirety, the programs are accessible to and useable by individuals with disabilities [28 CFR. Sec. 35.150].
- May not refuse to allow a person with a disability to participate in a service, program or activity simply because the person has a disability [28 CFR Sec. 35.130 (a)].
- Must make reasonable modifications in policies, practices and procedures that deny equal access to individuals with disabilities unless a fundamental alteration in the program would result [28 CFR Sec. 35.130(b) (7)].
- May not provide services or benefits to individuals with disabilities through programs that are separate or different unless the separate or different measures are necessary to ensure that benefits and services are equally effective [28 CFR Sec. 35.130(b)(iv) & (d)].
- Must take appropriate steps to ensure that communications with applicants, participants and members of the public with disabilities are as effective as communications with others [29 CFR Sec. 35.160(a)].
- Must designate at least one responsible employee to coordinate ADA compliance [28 CFR Sec. 35.107(a)]. This person is often referred to as the "ADA Coordinator." The public entity must provide the ADA coordinator's name, office address, and telephone number to all interested individuals [28 CFR Sec. 35.107(a)].
- Must provide notice of ADA requirements. All public entities, regardless of size, must provide
  information about the rights and protections of Title II to applicants, participants, beneficiaries,
  employees, and other interested persons [28 CFR Sec. 35.106]. The notice must include the
  identification of the employee serving as the ADA coordinator and must provide this information
  on an ongoing basis [28 CFR Sec. 104.8(a)].
- Must establish a grievance procedure. Public entities must adopt and publish grievance procedures providing for prompt and equitable resolution of complaints [28 CFR Sec. 35.107(b)].
   This requirement provides for a timely resolution of all problems or conflicts related to ADA compliance before they escalate to litigation and/or the federal complaint process.

This document has been created to specifically cover accessibility within the public rights of way and does not include information on City programs, practices, or building facilities not related to public rights of way.

### **ADA REQUIREMENTS**

According to the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design and the 2011 Proposed Guidelines for Pedestrian Facilities in the Public Right-of-Way (PROWAG) the following key design elements are required:

#### PEDESTRIAN ROUTES

- Access ways must be continuous with interconnected walkways, sidewalks, curb ramps, landings and crosswalks.
- Routes shall be firm, stable and slip resistant.
- Access ways shall have a 48" minimum clear width.
- If there is less than 5
  feet clear width,
  there must be

  dimensioned 5 feet
  by 5 feet minimum at
  least every 200 feet.

- Maximum 5%
  running slope (parallel to direction of travel) and 2% cross slope (perpendicular to direction of travel).
- Vertical discontinuities must be no more than ¼ inch.
- Horizontal openings in gratings and joints shall not permit passage of a sphere more than 13 mm (0.5 in) in diameter.
- Elongated openings in gratings shall be placed so that the long dimension is perpendicular to the dominant direction of travel.

#### **CURB RAMPS**

- Generally, curb ramps must be provided wherever a sidewalk or other pedestrian walkway crosses a curb.
- The ramp has the least running slope possible but must be 8.33% or less.
- The cross slope may not exceed 2%.
- The ramp must be at least 48 inches wide, not including the flared sides.
- The ramp must have detectable warnings at least 24 inches deep that extend the full width of the ramp.

- Detectable warnings consist of a series of small domes that contrast in color with the surrounding sidewalk or street.
- Transitions from the ramp to the walkway, gutter and street must be flush and free of abrupt changes.
- Grade breaks at the top and bottom of curb ramp runs shall be perpendicular to the direction of the ramp run. Grade breaks shall not be permitted on the surface of ramp runs and turning spaces. Surface slopes that meet at grade breaks shall be flush.
- The gutter must have a slope of no more than 5 percent toward the ramp.
- Landing dimensions must be a minimum of 4 feet by 4 feet.
- Gratings, access covers, and other appurtenances shall not be located on curb ramps, landings or gutters.

#### PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC SIGNALS

- Clear path must be at least 36 inches wide
- Push button mounting height is to be at least 15 inches and up to 48 inches
- Pedestrian push buttons must be located less than 5 feet from the crosswalk line that is farthest from the intersection
- Pedestrian push buttons must be between 1.5 and 10 feet from the edge of curb, shoulder, or pavement
- Accessible pedestrian signals (APS) shall face

- the intersection and be parallel to the crosswalk served
- Push buttons shall have locator tones for the DON'T WALK interval
- There must be audible indications during the WALK interval
- Refer to Part 4 of the Minnesota Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MnMUTCD) for complete details

### **SELF-EVALUATION**

The City of Alexandria is required, under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and 28CFR35.105, to perform a self-evaluation of its current transportation infrastructure policies, practices, and programs. This self-evaluation will identify what policies and practices impact accessibility and examine how the City implements these policies. The goal of the self-evaluation is to verify that, in

implementing the City's policies and practices, the department is providing accessibility and not adversely affecting the full participation of individuals with disabilities.

The self-evaluation also examines the condition of the City's Pedestrian Circulation Route/Pedestrian Access Route) (PCR/PAR) and identifies potential need for PCR/PAR infrastructure improvements. This will include the sidewalks, curb ramps, bicycle/pedestrian trails, traffic control signals and transit facilities that are located within the City rights of way. Any barriers to accessibility identified in the self-evaluation and the remedy to the identified barrier are set out in this transition plan.

#### **SUMMARY**

In June of 2017, the City of Alexandria conducted an inventory of pedestrian facilities within its public right of way consisting of the evaluation of the following facilities:

- 41.3 miles of sidewalks/trails
- 840 curb ramps
- 69 traffic control signals (by leg)
- 0 bus stops

The City of Alexandria evaluated their curb ramps on a 1-4 rating system. The descriptions of these ratings are as follows:

Curb Ramp Rating 1: Ramp is fully compliant.

Curb Ramp Rating 2: Ramp is non-compliant but has detectable warning panels.

Curb Ramp Rating 3: Ramp is non-compliant and does NOT have detectable warning panels.

Curb Ramp Rating 4: No ramp exists at sidewalk and curb intersection.

This evaluation method was chosen to separate out various severities of non-compliance allowing the City to better prioritize ramp replacement.

A detailed evaluation on how these facilities relate to ADA standards is found in Appendix A and will be updated periodically.

### POLICIES AND PRACTICES

#### PREVIOUS POLICIES

Since the adoption of the ADA, the City of Alexandria has striven to provide accessible pedestrian features as part of the City's capital improvement projects. As additional information was made available as to the methods of providing accessible pedestrian features, the City updated their procedures to accommodate these methods. The 2014 reconstruction of Broadway Street from 3<sup>rd</sup> Avenue to 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue included new sidewalk, curb ramps and traffic control signals. The 2013 Safe Routes to School project created new sidewalks and ramps to Lincoln Elementary School. In addition to these examples, the City of Alexandria has replaced sidewalks and curb ramps as part of other street improvement projects. In general, the street department has been making improvements from west to east in the downtown area.

#### **POLICY**

The City of Alexandria's goal is to continue to provide accessible pedestrian design features as part of the City capital improvement projects. The City has established ADA design standards and procedures as listed in Appendix F. These standards and procedures will be kept up to date with nationwide and local best management practices.

The City will consider and respond to all accessibility improvement requests. All accessibility improvements that have been deemed reasonable will be scheduled consistent with transportation priorities. The City will coordinate with external agencies to ensure that all new or altered pedestrian facilities within the City jurisdiction are ADA compliant to the maximum extent feasible.

Maintenance of pedestrian facilities within the public right of way will continue to follow the policies set forth by the City. All snow and ice shall be removed from sidewalks by the owner or tenant of the abutting private property. Please see Chapter 6 of the City Code for more information regarding streets and sidewalks. These projects will be incorporated into the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) on a case by case basis as determined by the City of Alexandria.

### PUBLIC OUTREACH

The City of Alexandria recognizes that public participation is an important component in the development of this document. Input from the community has been gathered and used to help define priority areas for improvements within the jurisdiction of the City of Alexandria.

Public outreach for the creation of this document consisted of the following activities:

A public hearing was held on December 18<sup>th</sup>, 2017 at the Planning Commission meeting. This document is available at the front desk at City Hall as well as on the city website (<a href="www.alexandriamn.city">www.alexandriamn.city</a>). This plan as well as the meeting was promoted on social media.

This document was also available for public comment. A summary of comments received and detailed information regarding the public outreach activities are located in Appendix C.

### **GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE**

Under the Americans with Disabilities Act, each agency is required to publish its responsibilities in regards to the ADA. A draft of this public notice is provided in Appendix D. If users of the City of Alexandria facilities and services believe the City has not provided reasonable accommodation, they have the right to file a grievance.

In accordance with 28 CFR 35.107(b), the City has developed a grievance procedure for the purpose of the prompt and equitable resolution of citizens' complaints, concerns, comments, and other grievances. This grievance procedure is outlined in Appendix D.

### **PROGRESS MONITORING**

The City of Alexandria's transition plan is a living document that will receive routine updates. Appendices will be updated annually to reflect the year's completed projects. Self-evaluation will be performed every five years to ensure facilities are compliant with the current standards. This document will be reviewed annually as part of the CIP process and updated as needed. There will be an annual progress report made to the City Council. With each update, a public comment period will be established to continue the public outreach. This Transition Plan is available to the public continually through the city's website.



































# APPENDIX B – SCHEDULE / BUDGET INFORMATION

### COST INFORMATION

### **UNIT PRICES**

Construction costs for upgrading facilities can vary depending on each individual improvement and conditions of each site. Costs can also vary on the type and size of project the improvements are associated with. Listed below are representative 2017 costs for some typical accessibility improvements based on if the improvements are included as part of a retrofit type project, or as part of a larger comprehensive capital improvement project.

Intersection corner ADA improvement retrofit: +/- \$3,000 per ramp

Traffic control signal APS upgrade retrofit: +/-\$ 7,500 per signal leg

Sidewalk / Trail ADA improvement retrofit: +/- \$5.00 per SF

**IMPROVEMENT COST** 

Reconstruct 665 pedestrian ramps: \$1,995,000

Traffic control signal APS upgrades (23 City responsibility): \$172,500

Sidewalk / Trail ADA improvement retrofit (SF): \$4,650,360

Total: \$6,817,860

### PRIORITY AREAS

Based on the results of the self-evaluation, the estimate costs associated with eliminating accessibility barriers within the targeted priority areas is as follows:

Reconstruct 46 pedestrian ramps: \$184,000

Sidewalk ADA improvement retrofit (46,900 SF): \$234,500

Total: \$418,500

### **ENTIRE JURISDICTION**

Based on the results of the self-evaluation, the estimated costs associated with providing ADA accessibility within the entire jurisdiction is \$6,817,860 regardless of responsible authority. This amount signifies a significant investment that the City of Alexandria is committed to making in the upcoming years with the assistance of other responsible agencies where applicable. A systematic approach to providing accessibility will be taken in order to absorb the cost into the City of Alexandria budget for improvements to the public right of way.

# APPENDIX C - PUBLIC OUTREACH

Public outreach for the creation of this document consisted of the following activities:

# APPENDIX D – GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

As part of the ADA requirements the City/County has posted the following notice outlining its ADA requirements:

### **PUBLIC NOTICE**

In accordance with the requirements of title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, the City of Alexandria will not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in City services, programs, or activities.

**Employment:** The City does not discriminate on the basis of disability in its hiring or employment practices and complies with all regulations promulgated by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission under title I of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

*Effective Communication:* The City will generally, upon request, provide appropriate aids and services leading to effective communication for qualified persons with disabilities so they can participate equally in the City programs, services, and activities, including qualified sign language interpreters, documents in Braille, and other ways of making information and communications accessible to people who have speech, hearing, or vision impairments.

**Modifications to Policies and Procedures:** The City will make all reasonable modifications to policies and programs to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all City programs, services, and activities. For example, individuals with service animals are welcomed in City offices, even where pets are generally prohibited.

Anyone who requires an auxiliary aid or service for effective communication, or a modification of policies or procedures to participate in a City program, service, or activity, should contact the office of the ADA Coordinator, as soon as possible but no later than 48 hours before the scheduled event.

The ADA does not require the City to take any action that would fundamentally alter the nature of its programs or services, or impose an undue financial or administrative burden.

The City will not place a surcharge on a particular individual with a disability or any group of individuals with disabilities to cover the cost of providing auxiliary aids/services or reasonable modifications of policy, such as retrieving items from locations that are open to the public but are not accessible to persons who use wheelchairs.

The City of Alexandria
Grievance Procedure under
the Americans with Disabilities Act

This Grievance Procedure is established to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 ("ADA"). It may be used by anyone who wishes to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability in the provision of services, activities, programs, or benefits by the City of Alexandria. The City's Personnel Policy governs employment-related complaints of disability discrimination.

The complaint should be in writing and contain information about the alleged discrimination such as name, address, phone number of complainant and location, date, and description of the problem. Alternative means of filing complaints, such as personal interviews or a tape recording of the complaint, will be made available for persons with disabilities upon request.

The complaint should be submitted by the grievant and/or his/her designee as soon as possible but no later than 60 calendar days after the alleged violation to:

The City will acknowledge receipt of the grievance to the complainant within 15 working days of its submittal. The City will also provide to the complainant within 15 working days of its submittal; 1) a response or resolution to the grievance or; 2) information on when the complainant can expect a response or resolution to the grievance.

If the grievance filed does not concern a City of Alexandria facility, the City will work with the complainant to contact the agency that has jurisdiction.

Within 60 calendar days of receipt, a City of Alexandria staff person will conduct an investigation necessary to determine the validity of the alleged violation. As a part of the investigation, the staff person would conduct an engineering study to help determine the City response. The staff person will take advantage of department resources and use engineering judgment, data collected, and any information submitted by the resident to develop a conclusion. A staff person will be available to meet with the complainant to discuss the matter as a part of the investigation and resolution of the matter. The City will document each resolution of a filed grievance and retain such documentation in the department's ADA Grievance File for a period of seven years.

The City will consider all specific grievances within its particular context or setting. Furthermore, the City will consider many varying circumstances including: 1) the nature of the access to services, programs, or facilities at issue; 2) the specific nature of the disability; 3) the essential eligibility requirements for participation; 4) the health and safety of others: and 5) the degree to which an accommodation would constitute a fundamental alteration to the program, service, or facility, or cause an undue hardship to the City of Alexandria.

Accordingly, the resolution by the City of Alexandria of any one grievance does not constitute a precedent upon which the City is bound or upon which other complaining parties may rely.

## File Maintenance

The City shall maintain ADA grievance files for a period of seven years.

# APPENDIX F – AGENCY ADA DESIGN STANDARDS AND PROCEDURES

### **DESIGN PROCEDURES**

### **INTERSECTION CORNERS**

Curb ramps or blended transitions will attempt to be constructed or upgraded to achieve compliance within all capital improvement projects. There may be limitations which make it technically infeasible for an intersection corner to achieve full accessibility within the scope of any project. Those limitations will be noted and those intersection corners will remain on the transition plan. As future projects or opportunities arise, those intersection corners shall continue to be incorporated into future work. Regardless on if full compliance can be achieved or not, each intersection corner shall be made as compliant as possible in accordance with the judgment of City staff.

### SIDEWALKS / TRAILS

Sidewalks and trails will attempt to be constructed or upgraded to achieve compliance within all capital improvement projects. There may be limitations which make it technically infeasible for segments of sidewalks or trails to achieve full accessibility within the scope of any project. Those limitations will be noted and those segments will remain on the transition plan. As future projects or opportunities arise, those segments shall continue to be incorporated into future work. Regardless on if full compliance can be achieved or not, every sidewalk or trail shall be made as compliant as possible in accordance with the judgment of City staff.

### TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNALS

Traffic control signals will attempt to be constructed or upgraded to achieve compliance within all capital improvement projects. There may be limitations which make it technically infeasible for individual traffic control signal locations to achieve full accessibility within the scope of any project. Those limitations will be noted and those locations will remain on the transition plan. As future projects or opportunities arise, those locations shall continue to be incorporated into future work. Regardless on if full compliance can be achieved or not, each traffic signal control location shall be made as compliant as possible in accordance with the judgment of City staff.

### **BUS STOPS**

Bus stops are not present within the limits of the City of Alexandria.

### OTHER TRANSIT FACILITIES

Additional transit facilities are not present within the limits of the City of Alexandria.

### OTHER POLICIES, PRACTICES AND PROGRAMS

Policies, practices and programs not identified in this document will follow the applicable ADA standards.

## **DESIGN STANDARDS**

# APPENDIX G – GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**ABA:** See Architectural Barriers Act.

ADA: See Americans with Disabilities Act.

**ADA Transition Plan:** Mn/DOT's transportation system plan that identifies accessibility needs, the process to fully integrate accessibility improvements into the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP), and ensures all transportation facilities, services, programs, and activities are accessible to all individuals.

**ADAAG**: See Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines.

**Accessible:** A facility that provides access to people with disabilities using the design requirements of the ADA.

**Accessible Pedestrian Signal (APS):** A device that communicates information about the WALK phase in audible and vibrotactile formats.

**Alteration**: A change to a facility in the public right-of-way that affects or could affect access, circulation, or use. An alteration must not decrease or have the effect of decreasing the accessibility of a facility or an accessible connection to an adjacent building or site.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA): The Americans with Disabilities Act; Civil rights legislation passed in 1990 and effective July 1992. The ADA sets design guidelines for accessibility to public facilities, including sidewalks and trails, by individuals with disabilities.

Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility Guidelines (ADAAG): contains scoping and technical requirements for accessibility to buildings and public facilities by individuals with disabilities under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990.

APS: See Accessible Pedestrian Signal.

**Architectural Barriers Act (ABA):** Federal law that requires facilities designed, built, altered or leased with Federal funds to be accessible. The Architectural Barriers Act marks one of the first efforts to ensure access to the built environment.

**Capital Improvement Program (CIP)**: The CIP for the Transportation Department includes an annual capital budget and a five-year plan for funding the new construction and reconstruction projects on the county's transportation system.

**Detectable Warning:** A surface feature of truncated domes, built in or applied to the walking surface to indicate an upcoming change from pedestrian to vehicular way.

**DOJ:** See United States Department of Justice

**Federal Highway Administration (FHWA):** A branch of the US Department of Transportation that administers the federal-aid Highway Program, providing financial assistance to states to construct and improve highways, urban and rural roads, and bridges.

FHWA: See Federal Highway Administration

**Pedestrian Access Route (PAR):** A continuous and unobstructed walkway within a pedestrian circulation path that provides accessibility.

**Pedestrian Circulation Route (PCR):** A prepared exterior or interior way of passage provided for pedestrian travel.

**PROWAG:** An acronym for the *Guidelines for Accessible Public Rights-of-Way* issued in 2005 by the U. S. Access Board. This guidance addresses roadway design practices, slope, and terrain related to pedestrian access to walkways and streets, including crosswalks, curb ramps, street furnishings, pedestrian signals, parking, and other components of public rights-of-way.

**Right of Way**: A general term denoting land, property, or interest therein, usually in a strip, acquired for the network of streets, sidewalks, and trails creating public pedestrian access within a public entity's jurisdictional limits.

**Section 504:** The section of the Rehabilitation Act that prohibits discrimination by any program or activity conducted by the federal government.

**Uniform Accessibility Standards (UFAS):** Accessibility standards that all federal agencies are required to meet; includes scoping and technical specifications.

**United States Access Board:** An independent federal agency that develops and maintains design criteria for buildings and other improvements, transit vehicles, telecommunications equipment, and electronic and information technology. It also enforces accessibility standards that cover federally funded facilities.

**United States Department of Justice (DOJ):** The United States Department of Justice (often referred to as the Justice Department or DOJ), is the United States federal executive department responsible for the enforcement of the law and administration of justice.
