

## MEMORANDUM

Subject: Placement of Campaign Signs

The City has received several inquiries regarding the placement of campaign signs. With the filing period now open, I wanted to provide you the following, as excerpted from the City Code:

Campaign Signs. Political campaign signs are permitted **on private property** in any zoning district subject to the express consent of the owner or occupant of such property and in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 211B.045 provided that:

- a. No such sign is located within one hundred (100) feet of any polling site;
- b. No such sign is placed within the public right-of-way;
- c. No such sign is posted earlier than 46 days before the primary in a State General Election year, which would be June 30 for the August 14 primary, and
- d. The political campaign sign is removed within ten (10) days following the election.

Please note that these regulations are relevant to signs located within the City of Alexandria. In general, if you have a sign located behind the public sidewalk, it will not be in the right-of-way. If there is no sidewalk, placing the sign four full paces back from the face of the curb line should be sufficient. If you have any question about whether one of your signs is safely out of the right-of-way, please contact me and I will be happy to view the sign and render an opinion. I should note that signs that are not in compliance with the above regulations are subject to removal, either by the private property owner/occupant, or by the City (if in the right-of-way or on other public property).

Please review the proposed locations for your campaign signs and ensure that they are fully compliant with the above regulations.
